

- The theory, method, and philosophy of teaching
 - Technically refers specifically to the teaching of children; the name for teaching adults is **andragogy**, but pedagogy is usually used as a catch-all term
 - **The science of teaching**

Theory	Role of Teacher	Role of Student	
	Cognitive	Teaches how to think	Learning happens in the mind by searching relationships between information
	Constructivist	Mentor	Learn from mistakes, learn from peers. Experience + developmental stage (not age)
	Behavioral	Everything - what will be done and how	Passive
	Connectivism	Facilitate the search for learning	Search for learning/information
	Adult & Humanist	Facilitator	Setting objectives, knowing learning preferences, connecting with past experience
